Person- and family-centered care puts the patient and family at the heart of every healthcare decision and empowers them to be genuine partners in their health care (Institute for Healthcare Improvement, 2021). Person-centered care (PCC) is holistic, individualized, just, respectful, compassionate, coordinated, evidence-based, and developmentally appropriate. PCC builds on a scientific body of knowledge that guides practice regardless of specialty or functional area (American Association of Colleges of Nursing, 2021).

PURPOSE OF THE SESSION: To illustrate exemplars of person-centered care (PCC) that improved or optimized health

DESIRED CONTENT/EXPERTISE:

- Engaging speakers to present EBP initiatives with a focus on PCC

PRESENTER AND ABSTRACT ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Must address PCC and scientific evidence. Possible examples:
 - a) Programs or initiatives that include a discussion/presentation of the evidence and its impact on patients/families
 - b) Shared decision-making case studies or approaches
 - c) Community engagement strategies (events programs) to improve health outcomes
 - d) Projects or programs that address health literacy
- Research, quality improvement, or EBP initiatives are eligible
- Works in progress will be considered

What is PICO?

- PICO is an acronym used to structure a question that helps the questioner search for an answer in the literature. The four parts are patient or problem (P); the intervention or exposure (I); the comparison intervention or exposure (C), if relevant; and the outcome of interest (O) (Eriksen & Frandsen, 2018).
 - Three purposes of PICO:
 1. To force the questioner to focus on what the person/patient or client believes to be the single most crucial issue and outcome
 2. To prompt the questioner to select language or key terms for the lit search
 3. To direct the questioner to identify the problem, intervention, and outcomes (Eriksen & Frandsen, 2018)

Community Core: Person-Centered Care	
1. Description of the Context	<i>Describe the location and setting; stakeholder/participant focus. May include mission & purpose.</i>
2. Background and Significance	<i>Describe the need for the program/practice change/policy. Provide baseline data (if available) and a model for change or EBP framework, if used</i>
3. Clinical/Research Question	<i>May be stated in a PICO format; may include a goal or specific aim</i>
4. Review of Literature w/ Evidence Synthesis (key takeaways from the published literature)	<i>May include a separate synthesis table; if EBP/QI, cite references to support the program or</i>
5. Recommendations based on the evidence synthesis (or identify the gap if you conducted research)	<i>Describe the recommended change, cite references to support the change</i>
6. Description of the Team	<i>State how the person/patient/family was part of the initiative</i>
7. Implementation (Methods) of the Initiative	<i>Consider the timeline, required resources, necessary approvals, patient/family education</i>
8. Outcomes	<i>Report outcomes (if the initiative is complete, compare results to baseline data; if the initiative is incomplete, report the future outcomes measurement plan)</i>
9. Lessons Learned	<i>May include an assessment of the project goal, identification of areas that need additional effort,</i>
10. Implications	<i>May include challenges, opportunities, limitations, and plans for sustainability of the program</i>
